
Figure 9 Area 1 (35 LA 159) looking S, note rise in foreground where site occurs




Figure 5 Looking SW toward Mohawk River ( far trees to left). Site 35 LA 159 in dense trees beyond surveyors.








Fig. 2. A horner from the southers Williamere Vallay. The areas beyond that he were macroines, an alkalite dress oup of femilies, outwor of southers (C. Peckersug 1965-55). Engenning after a drawin by Alfred T. Again, 1941.
